## **Reverse Applique Demo**

## **Items Needed:**

- Freezer Paper
- Top Fabric
- Applique Fabric
- Scissors
- Glue stick and/or pins
- Spray Starch
- Paint Brush
- Frixon Pen or Sharpie
  - o A Sharpie won't transfer to your fabric.
  - o A frixion pen may transfer to your fabric, but will disappear with heat.
  - Pencil or ink may transfer to your fabric.
- Template this can be an image you print out, or for a circle, a bowl.
- Iron & Ironing Surface

## **Directions:**

- 1. If you printed out an image for a template, cut it out.
- 2. Cut a piece of freezer paper larger than the template.
  - a. You can use multiple pieces of freezer paper for a stiffer template. Layer several pieces of freezer paper together shiny-side down and iron before proceeding. Use 2-5 layers.
- 3. Cut your top fabric to the size you want to work with.
- 4. Cut your applique fabric larger than your template by at least a couple inches on all sides. This will make it easier to work with.
- 5. Trace your template onto the dull side of the freezer paper. Make sure to use the reverse image if your template is directional.
- 6. Cut the center of the freezer paper out along your traced line.
- 7. Place the shiny side of the freezer paper on the wrong side of your top fabric.
- 8. With an iron set to the cotton setting, iron the freezer paper onto your top fabric.
- 9. Cut the fabric within the template away, leaving about half an inch of fabric next to the template.
- 10. Notch the fabric along curves about every ¼ inch. Be careful not to cut the freezer paper.
- 11. If using aerosol starch, spray a small amount into the lid. It will foam, wait a few seconds and it will become a liquid. If using a liquid starch, like Best Press, you can either use it from the bottle or pour some into another container.
- 12. Dip your paint brush into the starch and "paint" the starch onto the fabric to soak it.
- 13. Use your iron (or a tool) to turn the edges of your fabric and fold them over your template. Iron in parts until the complete edge is turned over and the edge is dry.
- 14. If using a glue stick, apply glue to the edges of your fabric.
- 15. Remove the freezer paper.
- 16. Place the wrong side of your top fabric on the right side of your applique fabric.
- 17. If you used a glue stick, iron the top fabric in place.
- 18. If necessary, pin the top fabric in place.
- 19. Sew to secure.
- 20. Trim applique fabric.
